



Q24 What is your age group?




Q25 What race/ethnicity do you identify with?






Q26 How long have you lived in the San Antonio region?




Q27 Do you live or own property in the plan area? If so, for how long?






Q28 If you live or own property in the plan area, in which neighborhood?




Q29 If you live in the Plan area, do you own or rent your home?
